5	Aston Brown Jersey Cider	Old Stag from Fairford	6.5	Cider	Medium	This is a single variety cider made from an apple discovered in the 50's at the Long Aston cider research establishment
6	Yellow Hammer Cider	Cotswold Coder Co from Highworth	6.0	Blended Cider	Medium	A blended cider from vintage varieties apples. (Vintage meaning very very old types of apple varieties)
7	Dabinett Cider	James McCrindles Cider from Blakeney	6.2	Cider	Medium	This is a single variety cider made from the 2nd most popular vintage apple varieties. Loved by cider makers for it's balanced profile of acidity and tannin.
8	Core Blend cider	Core Cider from Blakeney	5.0	Cider	Medium	This is crafted by James McCrindle but under his new label. It's a blend of

						vintage fruit made to be more of a session cider, but still carrying that smooth clean tannic flavour.
9	Medium Cider	Hitchcox Cider from Chalgrove	5.6	Cider	Medium	Made on the family farm in the way it has been for generations, from the fruit off the farm, of various varieties
10	Scrumpy Cider	Tutt's Clump From West Berkshire	5.5	Cider	Medium Dry	Made from a blend of Somerset brown cider apples in a West Country style
11	Farmhouse Traditional Cider	Hitchcox Cider from Chalgrove, Oxfordshire	7.5	Cider	Medium Dry	As the name suggests, a traditional farmhouse style coder made from a variety of old farm orchard apples
12	Three Counties Cider	Priors Tipple from Stanway	7.0	Cider	Medium Dry	Made from the new cider variety called 3 counties. Sharp crisp and refreshing.

17	Ghandis flip flop Dry	Ragged Stone from Hartpury	7.6	Cider	Dry	As the name suggest, this cider is dry due to being made of vintage fruit that is left to ferment right out to dry leaving no residual sweetness.

18	Winnels Longdon Perry	Old Stag Perry from Fairford	6.5	Perry	Medium	This is a very old variety of perry, probably 250 years old, originally grown by Mr Winnal in Longdon, Gloucestershire. It's a clean fruity and fresh flavour.
19	Blakeney Red Perry	Bushel + Peck from Winchcombe	6.0	Perry	Medium	A blend of perry pears and dessert pears picked from east Gloucestershire
20	James McCrindles Perry	James McCrindles perry from Blakeney	6.5	Perry	Medium Dry	This old variety of perry was first discovered in Blakeney in the Forest of Dean and has a great balance of acid and tannin and is a favourite of perry makers.
21	Gregg's Blended Perry	Gregg's Pitt from Much Marcle	6.0	Perry	See >	This is made from three perry pear varieties. Butt, Oldfield and Blakeney Red. Blending perry is an art and James Marsden has managed this to become a prolific champion perry maker in many competitions. This is also available in sparkling champagne style in Claridge's in London if you fancy a trip
22	Tutt's Perry	Tutt's Clump From West Berkshire	6.0	Perry	Medium Dry	A blend of perry from their farm that has also won awards. Rounded fresh and fruity.
23	Fat Bottomed Girls	Ragged Stone from Hartpury	7.0	Perry	Medium Dry	This was last years winner at this festival.  Named after the shape of the pears.  Refreshingly Fresh, light and crisp.
24	Minchew's Mayhem	Stuart Minchew Perry from Tewkesbury	7.0	Perry	Medium	This is a blend of fruit picked local to Tewkesbury, which has a lot of perry trees around. Perry is a very slow growing tree so trees tend to be very old, 100 yrs, when cropping at their best. Stuart is a master at his craft and doesn't

						make much, so to get this from his is somewhat of a rarity.
